One of the things that can be really difficult for us as adults and parents is to switch off from the day's activities when we get home and have time with our families. I don't know about you, but my brain is usually still processing the day, planning and preparing for the following day or week, and running through the solutions. We can have a hard time changing hats – not just from work to home, but also from home to work.

So how do we do it? How do we go from home to work or vice versa and keep our minds where they need to be? 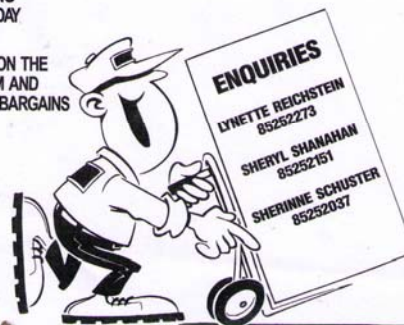
